## June 15 Program - Scholarships

**Marilyn Mansfield** introduced Rotary's annual Davis school scholarship program. Each year the club provides several major awards for the Davis Schools, totaling \$13,750 for 2009.

At Davis High, the Rotary Cup goes to the graduating senior with the highest grades. This year's winner was **Antoine Koehl**. Other Rotary-funded scholarships at the high school went to **Shirley Gao** and **Yuxin Sun**. **Michael Chung** and **Shelly Marshall** won scholarships supported by Rotary and Davis Waste Removal, and **Keirman Gatewood** won the Rotary/Novozyme Scholarship. PE teacher **Penny Smith** was Rotary teacher of the year.

Davis School for Independent Study: **Taryn Brackman** (Rotary Scholarship), and **Cyrus Kuhlman** (Rotary/DWR scholarship).

Da Vinci High School: **Hilary Harvey** (Rotary Scholarship) and **Eli Marable** (Rotary/DWR scholarship).

King High School: **Jorge Mirales** and **Taylor Massey** (Rotary Scholarship) and **Samantha Eusebio** (Rotary/DWR).

All of the high school scholarship funds are held by the appropriate high school, and disbursed directly to the winning student's college or vocational school for payment of education expenses.

Three awards are also made at the junior high school level. These are awarded to two students at each school, who then work with school administrators to determine a use for the award funds.

## Bill Roe on Vietnam and the Philippines

Last January **Bill Roe** and his wife **Nancy** spent several weeks in Vietnam and the Philippines. They took hundreds of great photos – many of them portraits of people they met – which Bill showed to the club. Bill said the Vietnamese were friendly, often spoke English, and served great food. They visited Ho Chi Minh City (formerly Saigon), Hanoi, Hue, and Hmong people in mountains near China.

He found the Philippines to be a blend of Asian and Spanish culture, with American influence too (lots of English spoken). They went to a multi-day festival off the tourist track, an opportunity for plenty of outstanding photos.
