Dean reported that the new Rotary shade structure at Yolo County Fairgrounds is progressing. It should be ready for the Western BBQ on 18 April, expanded this year to include ten local clubs.

Charre Symms gave us more good news on Big Night: the event netted over \$34,000 for our Child Abuse Prevention Program. Charre again recognized Peggy Hoyt for her magnificent donations of items to both the live and silent auctions. She also informed us that the wines contributed by our members brought in \$2000.

President Debbie honored Marilyn Mansfield for her further contributions to the Rotary Foundation, awarding her a tenth additional Paul Harris Fellow recognition, this one in the name of Dick Mansfield's daughter.

Prez Debbie also awarded Mike Peterson and Bruce Hartsough, editors of this very publication, the week's "The Future of Rotary is in Your Hands" pins for their dedicated service. Greg Gibbs reported that Village Harvest collected a record haul of fruit from local backyard trees, presumably due to the response he received to his

request at the 1 February meeting. The gleanings go to worthy causes such as STEAC and Yolo County Food Bank.

**Rotary Millionaire**

Assistant District Governor Steve Lack offered us an excellent Rotary-flavored version of Who Wants to be a Millionaire. Any of the selected contestants who correctly answered four questions received 100 points (equivalent to a \$100 contribution) towards a Paul Harris Fellow recognition. As in the "real" game, contestants could use three lifelines: ask a friend, poll the audience, and 50-50. The friends seemed fairly reliable, the audience a little less so, and of course the 50-50 was beneficial when it did not eliminate the correct answer.

Our group performed like champs, with the first three contestants – Roger Gambatese, Yvonne Clinton and Bill Streng – nailing every query thrown at them. Later, Alan Telford also successfully ran the gauntlet. Contestants who stumbled on any of the questions received a Rotary pin, not a bad consolation prize.

The questions all involved Rotary history. Some examples: Which club was the first to establish luncheon meetings? (Oakland) When was the first International Convention held? (1910) How many International Conventions have been held in San Francisco? (4) Which club did Davis Rotary first sponsor? (Dixon) And, the members of which club must travel the longest distance to make up? (Papeete, Tahiti)
