Program: Coffee Chemical Engineering class at UC Davis

Sharon introduced Professor Bill Ristenpart who helped to start a coffee chemical engineering course at UC Davis. Ristenpart is a UCD graduate and also studied at Harvard. Bill opened the conversation explaining how chemical engineering is really about designing a process where matter is converted into a more useful form. Examples include include silicone into computer circuits and barley into beer. Chemical engineering is growing at the campus as enrollment has tripled over the past 15 years.

Coffee is now a \$50 billion dollar industry in the US. Many flavors are possible, but most of what is consumed doesn't include these diverse tastes. Coffee must be roasted correctly and consumed quickly in order to enjoy the different tastes. These key points inspired the creation of the "Design of Coffee" UCD class. Lab students learn everything from how a coffee machine works to what it takes to create a cup of coffee.

Breaking News: It turns out that coffee beats beer... on campus. The number of students per academic year is higher in coffee compared to the brewing beer course. Because the product isn't naturally grown here, coffee has been an orphaned educational industry in the US. Still, the obvious interest and economic impact shows that a change in strategy is necessary. UC Davis may be the perfect institution between the research and focus on agriculture at the university.
