WEEKLY PROGRAM:

"Adult: Distracted Driving". CHP Officer Rodney Fitzhugh.



Officer Fitzhugh is a 15 year veteran of the California Highway Patrol, born and raised in Fairfield. He is currently serving as the Public Information Officer for the Yolo County CHP in Woodland. He is their liaison to the media and speaks to the public frequently about safety messages.

What constitutes a "Distracted Driver"? Anything that takes attention away from driving, i.e. putting make-up on, shaving, reading, talking on the phone, texting etc.. A ticket for distracted driving is \$20 plus county fee for the 1st offense. However, laws will be changing after July of 2021, fines will increase and they will also be considered "a point" on your driving record.

What can we do as community members? His suggestion is to lead by example and put our phones in the glove box when driving. Not doing so can lead to grave consequences. He gave the example of his good friend CHP Officer Kirk Griess who lost his life on the shoulder of I-80 in 2018, run over by a distracted driver. That is why this topic is so personal for Officer Fitzhugh.
