Mark Berman – Was it Mark that was sponsoring AB 1346 to phase out gas powered mowers & blowers? No Marc Berman the assemblyman.



Sandy is the Executive Director for OLLI via UC Davis Extension. OLLI offers non-credit courses with no assignments or grades for adults over the age of 50. Philanthropist Bernard Osher founded the program in 1977 and his foundation has made grants to help offer classes through 120 Universities across the country.

OLLI classes can help people to continue learning about what they are interested in or introducing them to new areas of interest. OLLI classes encourage interaction (rather than professor lectures) and can be a great way to meet new friends.

OLLI at UC Extension offers over 100 courses a year. Courses range from: Writing workshop, photography, Gardening, Hands-on coffee roasting lab, Finding the right bike for you. Music of Motown to name a few. The cost is \$35 a quarter. During COVID classes have rotated to zoom. They are always looking for volunteer teachers, facilitators and new students.
