Sergeant's Report

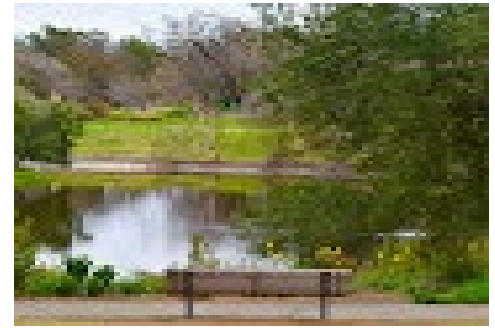

"UC Davis Arboretum and Public Garden" by Garth Lindley & Carmia Feldman.



Carmia Feldman (Assistant Director of Development, UC Davis Arboretum & Public Garden) spoke to the club about the history of the Arboretum. It started in 1936 with faculty planting their collections in a garden. It has grown over the years and now occupies 100 acres along side the banks of the old north channel of Putah Creek. The collection includes 22,000 trees and plants adapted to a Mediterranean climate, with hot, dry summers and cool wet winters. Carmia mentioned that there has been tremendous growth in the Arboretum thanks to community engagement, volunteers and their hard work as well as support from local donors.

In addition to its viewing beauty, they seek to engage and teach students about sustainable horticulture and leadership. They have a program called "Learn by Leading" and senior student Michelle Lester spoke to the club about her experience in the program. She enjoyed the outdoors and got involved. She organized nature workshops and helped promote their newsletter "New Leaf", she eventually mentored other new students in the program. She greatly enjoyed her time helping at the Arboretum and credits the experience to skills that she feels have set her up for success in life.
